West leads the HA. West continues with the HJ, queen, king, ruffed. South plays the S6: king – five – ten. West returns a heart. South ruffs and plays the S7: jack – queen – four, followed by the D3: four – king – ace. E-W play reverse count.

W. should play the DJ and stick declarer in dummy. Now E scores a diamond ruff and switches to CJ for four down.

S is in 4H doubled. After DK, ace, South wins and ruffs a diamond, followed by SA and a spade ruff, East playing S8, S10. South ruffs another diamond. East has shown an odd number of diamonds. How should South continue?

On S played CA, CJ to CQ. W played DK and South was one off. Another S played a third spade from dummy. If E pitches a club, then S ruff and CA, CK, D ruff with HA and spade. If E ruffs high he has no good exit. E ruffed with H5, then HJ from South, HA and heart exit. E had 3 Hs, but was endplayed in clubs.

W would have done better to lead a spade for 1 or 2 off.

Best for S is a club at T2. Finesse the CJ. If W had the CA, probably would have played it. Later cross to the HK (W would not lead H6 from Q-9-6), pitch a spade on the CK and lose 1 spade, 2 diamonds and a club.

E will not have SA-K. E would have won T 1. If E had SA-Q, South would have won T1. If E had SA-K-Q, E would overtake at T1. Thus, South has the SA and East K-Q.

Best is to play S8 at T2. South can win and play HA, H ruff, D ruff, H ruff. The Hs are set up, but after ruffing from dummy, S loses trump control. S has HJ-6, CA-K-10 and E-W can hold S to just the top trumps.

The CQ at T2 works on the actual layout, but would let 4C make if S had HA-K-J-10-x-x and the same in the other suits.

At the table, W switched to the DA at T2. Fatal. S ruffed, played HA, H ruff, D ruff, H ruff, D ruff, CA, CK, SA, HK and had ten tricks for +710.
