

STATE MIXED TEAMS – 2016

Supplementary Tournament Regulations

This competition is conducted under the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2007, supplemented by the Tournament Regulations of the NSWBA as amended and these Supplementary Regulations. In case of conflict between these Supplementary Regulations and the NSWBA Tournament Regulations, the Supplementary Regulations shall apply.

1 The Event

- 1.1 The event will be held over four nights as scheduled in the official NSWBA Program.
- 1.2 The event will be run as a standard Swiss Teams competition playing two 14-board matches each night. The appropriate WBF continuous IMP to VP conversion scale will be used.
- 1.4 All systems will be permitted. Pairs may not claim protected pair status. A copy of Yellow systems, along with a suggested defence, must be submitted to the Chairman of the Tournament Committee at least 1 week before the start of the first session.

2 Eligibility

- 2.1 Teams are to consist of 4, 5 or 6 players and contain at least one male and one female member.
- 2.2 At least one male and one female player must play in each match. Failure to comply with this regulation will make the team ineligible to win prizes.
- 2.3 Teams that are in breach of regulations 2.1 are allowed to enter but are ineligible to win prizes.

3 Fees

The entry fee as specified on the official brochure must be paid in full on the first night.

4 Substitutions

Substitutions are to be in accordance with the standard NSWBA substitution regulations. There is no requirement for males to substitute for males or females for females, but the team must comply with regulation 2.2 at all times to be eligible for prizes.

5 Prizes

- 5.1 The team coming first will receive \$400.
- 5.2 The team coming second will receive \$280.
- 5.3 The team coming third will receive 4 bottles of wine.
- 5.3 In the case of ties the prizes will be shared between all tied teams. The NSWBA will provide further bottles of wine if appropriate.
