## COUNTRY OPEN PAIRS CHAMPIONSHIPS 2017

### SUPPLEMENTARY TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

1. The State Open Pairs and Country Open Pairs Championship Finals will be held on 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> November 2017.
2. The upper limit to the number of pairs that may be sent is the entire qualifying field. Clubs will be charged per pair according to the following table:

| Number of pairs sent to final | Cost per pair | Total charge to club |
|-------------------------------|---------------|----------------------|
| 1                             | \$120         | \$120                |
| 2                             | \$110         | \$220                |
| 3                             | \$100         | \$300                |
| 4                             | \$90          | \$360                |
| 5                             | \$80          | \$400                |
| 6                             | \$70          | \$420                |
| 7+                            | \$60          | \$420+               |

3. Clubs and players should note that pairs that have not qualified via an affiliated club will be accepted into the Final at a cost of \$120 per pair. They may enter by ringing the NSWBA Office (9264 8111) or enter on-line via the NSWBA website, <http://www.nswba.com.au/tourn/calendar>.
4. To get the benefits of the discounted entry fees specified in the table above, **all the pairs must have entered and played the club qualifying event as *bona fide* pairs - it is not allowable for players who have qualified in different partnerships to play together in the Final as club representatives.** Such players may, of course, enter the Final directly as allowed under clause 3.
5. The Championship is conducted under the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2007 and the Tournament Regulations of the New South Wales Bridge Association, as amended.
6. Yellow Systems are not permitted at any stage of the Championship.
7. Players must have an **active** Australian Bridge Federation masterpoint number.

8. Players do not have to be members of the club at which the qualifying competition is held.
9. Club qualifying competitions must be held over a maximum of four sessions.
10. Directors must be qualified at Club level or above.
11. Pairs playing in the State Final are allowed one substitution on the Saturday and no substitutions on the Sunday. All substitutions must be in accordance with the NSWBA Tournament Regulations, submitted via the on-line substitution form at <http://www.nswba.com.au/forms/substitute.asp> and must be approved in advance by the NSWBA Tournament Committee.
12. The top 14 pairs on Saturday will qualify for the State Open Pairs Final. In addition, the top 14 pairs from the non-metropolitan clubs will qualify to a separate Country Open Pairs Final. (The size of the Country Final will be reduced if fewer than 14 eligible pairs are available.) Country pairs who qualify for the State Final may choose which Final they contend.
13. Clubs located outside the Sydney metropolitan region may apply to the NSWBA for financial assistance for pairs representing their clubs in the Championship Final. Only one subsidy per club will be allowed.
14. Masterpoints.

***Red masterpoints are awarded for any club qualifying competition - a club representative pair does not need to attend the Championship Final.***

- Red masterpoints will be awarded at State Championship level with a weighting of 5.00 and will cost \$1.20 each. They are to be calculated by the scoring program or club masterpoint secretary.
- Red masterpoints will be awarded on a sessional basis only; *i.e.* there is NO outright award. If a club runs a qualifying session(s), followed by a final and consolation, only the players in the final will receive red masterpoints. Red masterpoints cannot be awarded to players in the consolation as they cannot qualify for the next stage of the competition. (Green masterpoints may be awarded to these players as for a normal club session, through the standard quarterly return.)
- These sessions are run under the NSWBA's grade B (State Championship) allowance – do not use your club's B4c sessions.
- ***Please Note:*** The red masterpoints awarded must **NOT** be entered on the club's quarterly return to the ABF Masterpoint Centre but must be ***sent to the Tournament Organiser.*** They may be entered on Congress Award forms (obtainable from the ABF Masterpoint Centre) showing the names and ABF numbers of all players in the section who have won masterpoints, or electronically, with an appropriate file. ***They must not be sent to the ABF Masterpoint Centre.***

15. An Excel form to assist clubs is available for download from the NSWBA website <http://www.nswba.com.au/tourn/state/se.asp?Y=2017&E=sop>. This is to be completed and used as a cover sheet and check list and then emailed to the NSWBA. Participating clubs must send the following to the NSWBA by email:
- The completed coversheet available from the NSWBA website (see above) as an Excel file. This will include the names and ABF numbers of the nominated pairs;
  - A complete copy of the results of each qualifying session as a pdf, html or txt file;
  - **The masterpoint file as a .red file. This is mandatory if you score using a computer.**
16. Clubs should note that **red masterpoints** for the qualifying sessions will be awarded after the Championship Final.
17. The Tournament Organiser will issue each participating club with an invoice to cover the entry fees of representative pairs and the costs of any red masterpoints issued. **Do not send any money until you receive the invoice.**
